During the last six decades there has been tremendous increase in the number of poor orphans, widows, patients, disabled and needy among the Muslims of India who constitute 14.2 percent of the population of our beloved country (as per Census 2011). Such a pathetic condition is definitely a cause for serious national concern. Innumerable widows and poor women and men live under deplorable circumstances of want and squalor. Tens of thousands of children are not able to enjoy their innocence and have, instead, to work in tea shops and similar other places. Young illiterate girls in large numbers stare into the eyes of their poor parents anxiously awaiting matrimony. Sometimes people have no option but to beg on the street. Many of our youth do not have access to education despite having intellectual capacity to do so.

Children are God's gifts to us. They become the medium of God's kindness to the humanity. They will InshaAllah constitute our future generations. It is crucial to ensure good education for them so that they may imbibe high moral values and a balanced personality. They are supposed to be a source of domestic and social pleasure and a channel for our ultimate salvation in the life hereafter. The community has moral obligation to take substantial steps for ensuring proper upbringing and educational development of the orphans and other poor children.

There is Godly injunction for helping the orphans, widows, poor and the downtrodden. Faith binds us to give precedence to the requirement of the hungry, the orphan and the needy neighbor over ourselves.

Thus some seriously concerned citizens of India got together and established Zakat Foundation of India in 1998. This organization has been able to bring happiness and prosperity in a large number of poor families and has been helping the orphans, widows, the old persons, the students, the girls for marriage, the deprived and the displaced etc. Praise be to God, the Cherisher and Sustainer of the worlds, Most Gracious, Most Merciful.

The ZFI's is now an ongoing organized process running continuously year after year. Yet thousands of hopefuls still look towards the Foundation which, though being conscious of their pain, finds itself incapacitated to help them for want of additional resources. Happy Homes (for Boys & Girls)



ZFI runs two Happy Homes (one each for girls and boys) in New Delhi and a third one for boys in Bahraich (U.P.). Most of the children are from riot affected areas of Assam & Gujarat. At “Happy Homes (Boys & Girls)” arrangements are going on for food, shelter, clothing, education, medical assistance and entertainment etc for these children. They study in the best school of the area. Happy Homes have their own transport. Additional tutors visit there for helping the children in homework and another set of tutors impart scriptural and moral education. Besides, there is . Orphans and very poor children have now started joining from other states also. Large number of applications are still pending but the Foundation does not have resources to admit additional children.

Zakat Al-Fitr

Zakat Al-Fitr is compulsory on every Muslim; old or young, male or female, freeman or slave and evidence to that is the hadith reported by Ibn Umar (may Allah be pleased with him) that the Prophet (prayers and peace of Allah be upon him) enjoined the payment of one Sa' of dates or one Sa' of barley as Zakat-ul-Fitr on every Muslim slave or free, male or female, young or old, and he ordered that it be paid before the people went out to offer the Eid prayer. (One Sa' = 3 Kilograms approx.) [Sahih Bukhari]



Medical Services

Mercy Home India

The Sachar Committee Report indicates that the only place where Muslims are present in substantial number in India are the hospital queues of patients. ZFI had already gauged this grim situation. Several years ago the Foundation established in Delhi a charitable medical centre known as Mercy Home India that is now running in Delhi where poor people live without proper medical support. Hundreds of poor patients are attended to every day and medicines are dispensed in collaboration with Hamdard Medical College.

At Bawana there was no regular mosque. Hence, Masjid Fatima has been established there in 2009 through non Zakat funds. Funds are required for expansion.

Also, at Bawana, New Delhi and in Kashmir ZFI is running its Tailoring & Knitting Institute and Fatima School cum Madarsa.

Seriously injured persons affected by natural calamities & communal riots are brought to Delhi for successful treatment.

Whenever required, the Foundation organizes specialized medical aid for the poor patients at All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) and other hospitals.

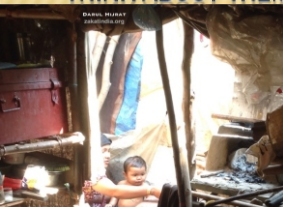

for Allah says in Quran Karim (59.8): Charity is also for the poor emigrants who have been driven from their homes and their property, as they were seeking favor with God and His pleasure. Thus, ZFI has earmarked its plot of land measuring 1,100 sq met. in New Delhi and has accommodated 220 Rohingya refugees there. It's known as Darul Hijrat. Currently, tents have been provided to them. Part of the land has been raised by making a platform with financial help (US dollars ten thousand - equivalent to Indian Rs 6,40,000/-) received from United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) office in Delhi. Interfaith Coalition for Peace and God's Grace Foundation have granted Rs 4,00,000/- and Rs 200,000/- respectively. These Rohingya children's education is also sponsored by ZFI. The bigger project of constructing multi-story accommodation is of Rs 50 lakh.

Communal Riots Relief

In 2014 & 2015, fresh wave of riots & killings flared up in Kokrajhar area of Assam. More than 100 persons were killed and tens of thousands were displaced. Earlier, in 2011-12 similar riots had occurred. ZFI established a new Happy Home in Bahraich for orphans besides accommodating another about 25 riot affected girls & boys in its Happy Homes in New Delhi.

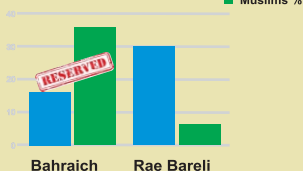

Dealing with the Basic Systemic Defect

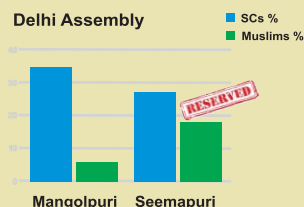
Disproportionately very low Muslim representation in Parliament & Assemblies

In 2006, the Sachar Committee (officially named as Prime Minister's High Level Committee on Muslims) pointed out that the Muslim pre-dominant constituencies of parliament & state assemblies are erroneously reserved for Scheduled Castes; thus, no Muslim can contest from there. For instance, Nagina (State of UP) with 53.54% Muslim population is reserved for Scheduled Castes (21.34%). Conversely, in the same state, Mainpuri (5.41% Muslims & 19.82% SCs) and Banda (5.81% Muslims & 23.53% SCs) are not reserved. Likewise, Karimganj in the state of Assam with 52.3% Muslim population and 12.95% SCs is reserved for SCs. In the same state, Dibrugarh (4.5% Muslims) and Jorhat (5% Muslims) are not reserved. Hence, Sachar Committee strongly recommended that the next Delimitation Commission should be immediately mandated to look into and remove these anomalies. but this has not happened. ZFI runs its regular Department of Delimitation and, based on its researches, it has been vehemently piloting the implementation of this Sachar recommendation. Presentations were made by the ZFI President before the Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi, the Congress Vice President Mr Rahul Gandhi and Aam Aadmi Party leaders. Consequently, in the run-up to the Lok Sabha elections, the Congress included this issue in its additional mid-term manifesto. Efforts have to continue in this regard as this is most important achievable restoration of Muslim constitutional right in India.

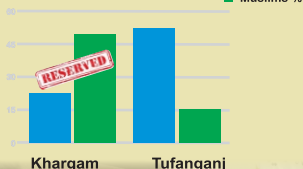
Uttar Pradesh Assembly



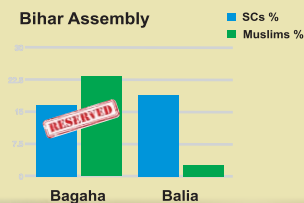

EMPOWERMENT THROUGH PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT

Sir Syed Coaching & Guidance Centre for Civil Services

In 2007, Zakat Foundation of India established Sir Syed Coaching & Guidance Centre in Delhi and took upon itself the responsibility of financing the best possible coaching to the academically bright but financially needy candidates for civil services competitive examinations. They are known as ZFI Fellows.

Competitive Cycle

ZFI organizes its all-India entrance test and viva. Based on these, ZFI Fellows for that year are selected out of those who are most brilliant but also most needy. These Fellows begin their coaching in the country's top level coaching institutes in Delhi from June. They write their Prelims in August next year, Mains in following November followed by UPSC Interview in next April. The final result is declared in May. During this competitive cycle of 22 months the ZFI Fellows stay in ZFI's civil services hostels in Delhi. Thus, one competitive cycle is of 22 months during which ZFI spends, on the average, Rs 2.25 lakh (USD 3,400) on each candidate. You are welcome to contribute.

But, all this is still insufficient. Muslims are badly lagging behind all other socio religious groups by way of representation in governmental decision making and implementation. Hence, ZFI has planned to establish in Delhi Sir Syed Coaching & Guidance Centre for 500 candidates including their residential facility. Your kind support is solicited.
